



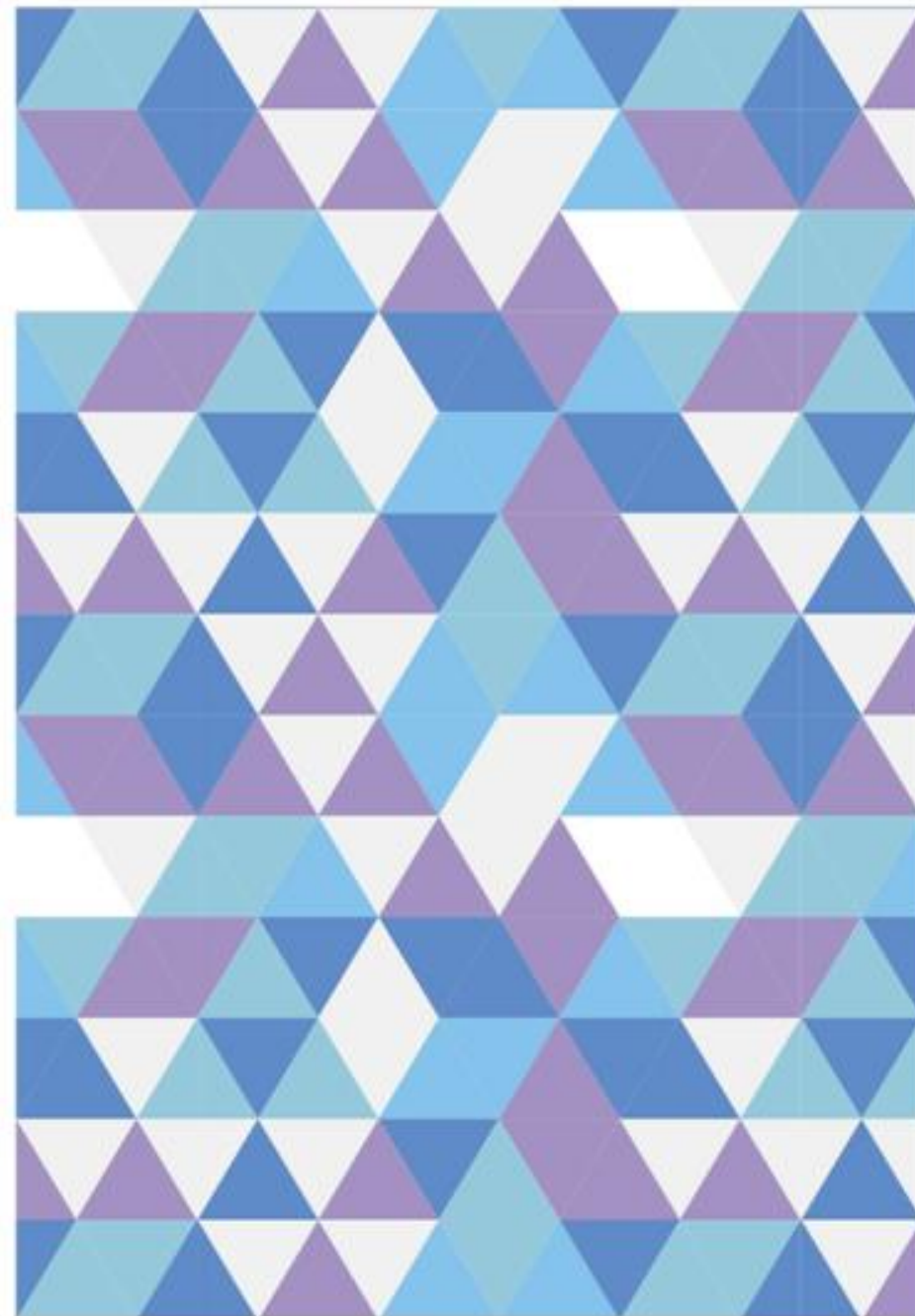

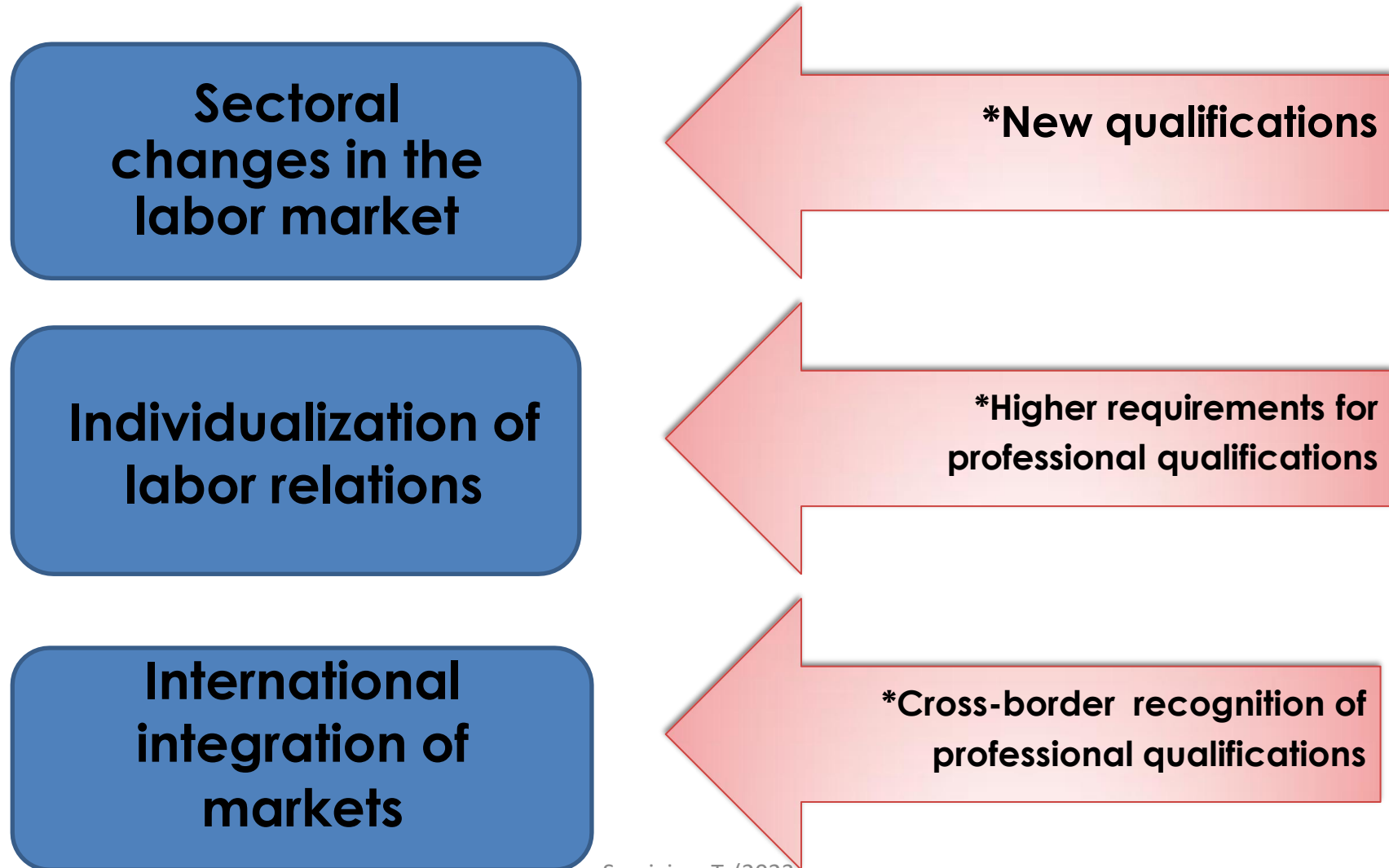

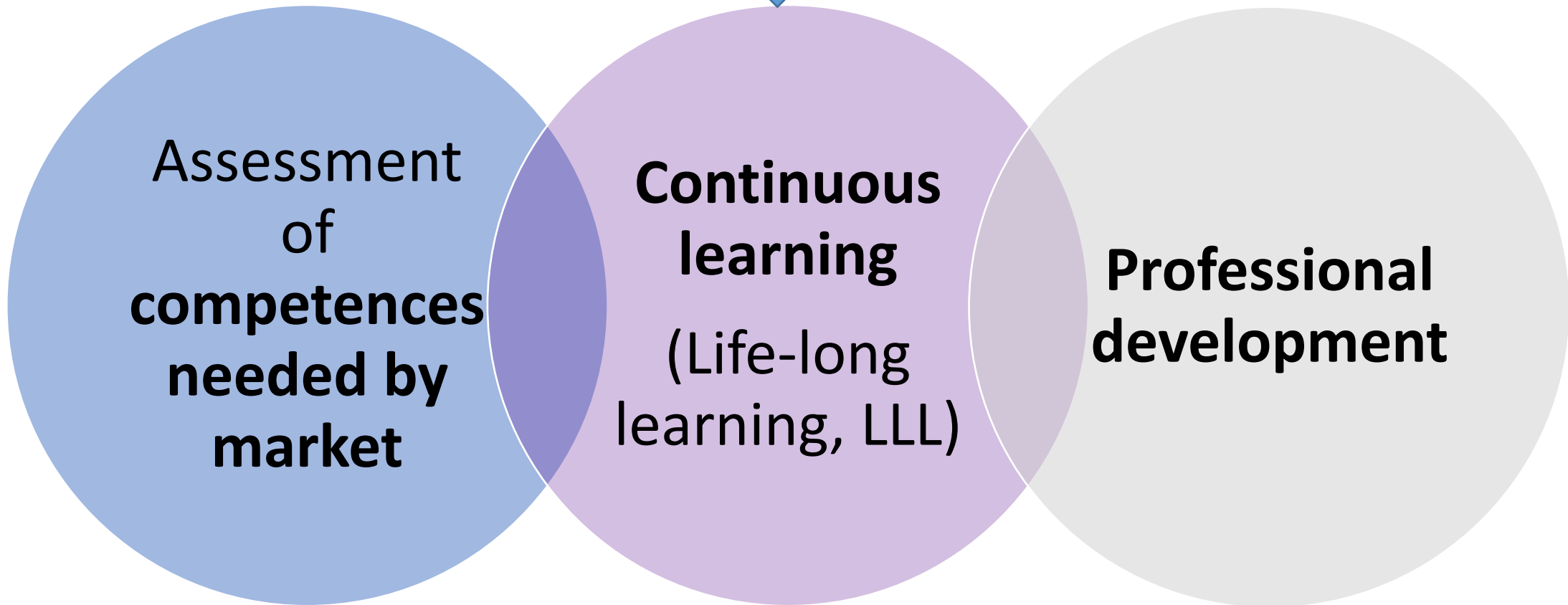

Ukraine's experience in developing the qualification system

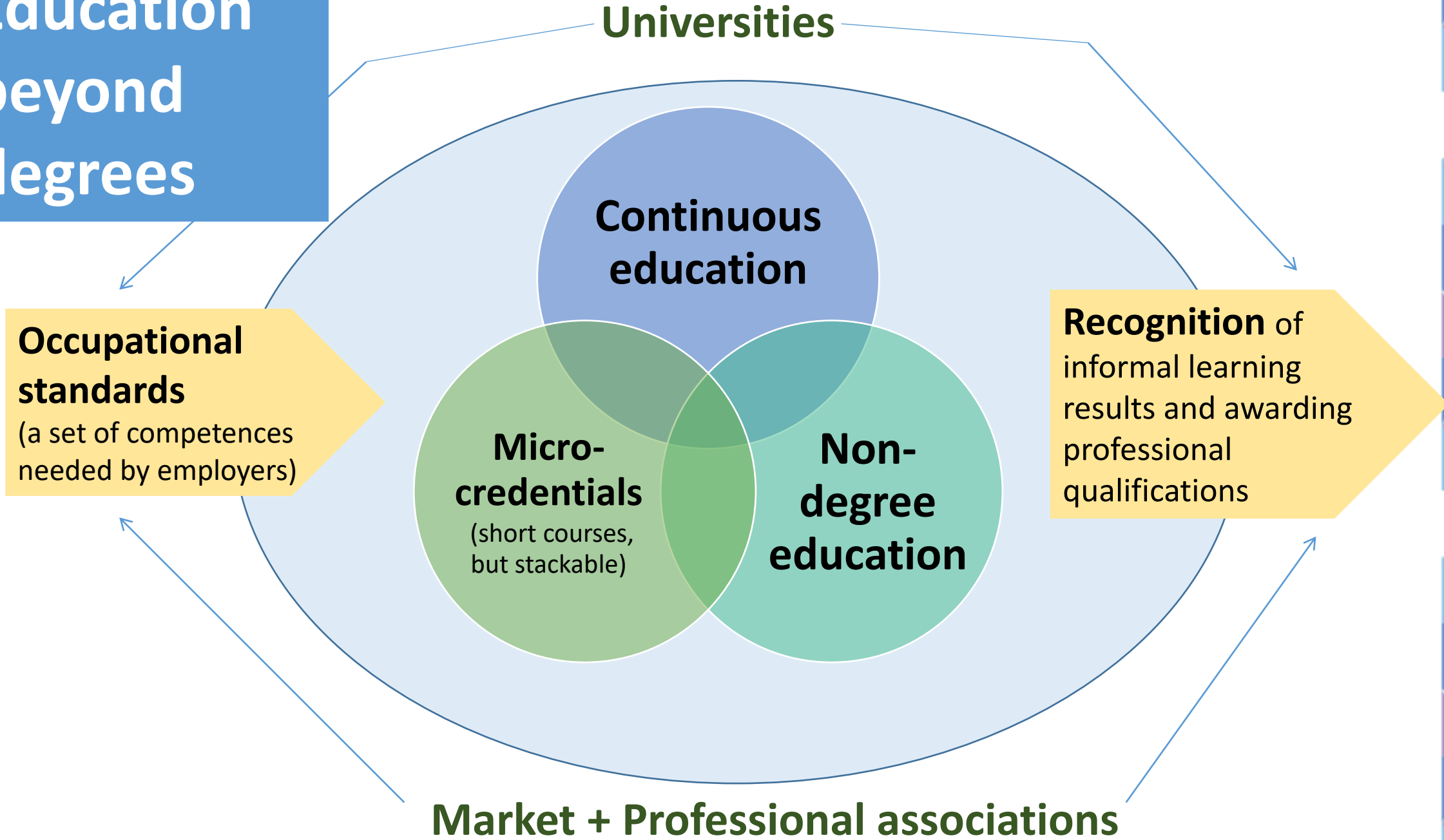
- Law of Ukraine «**On Education** (2017)

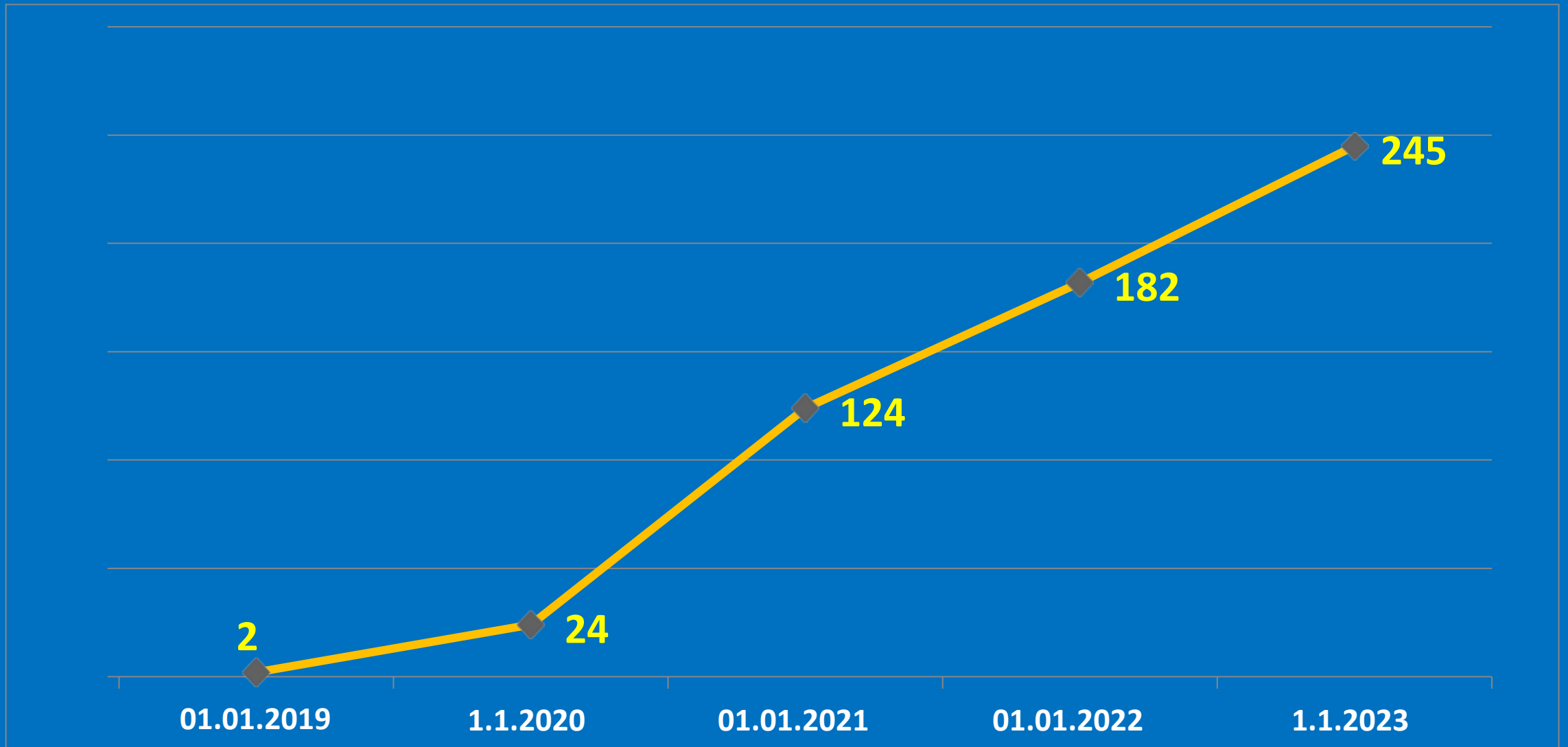

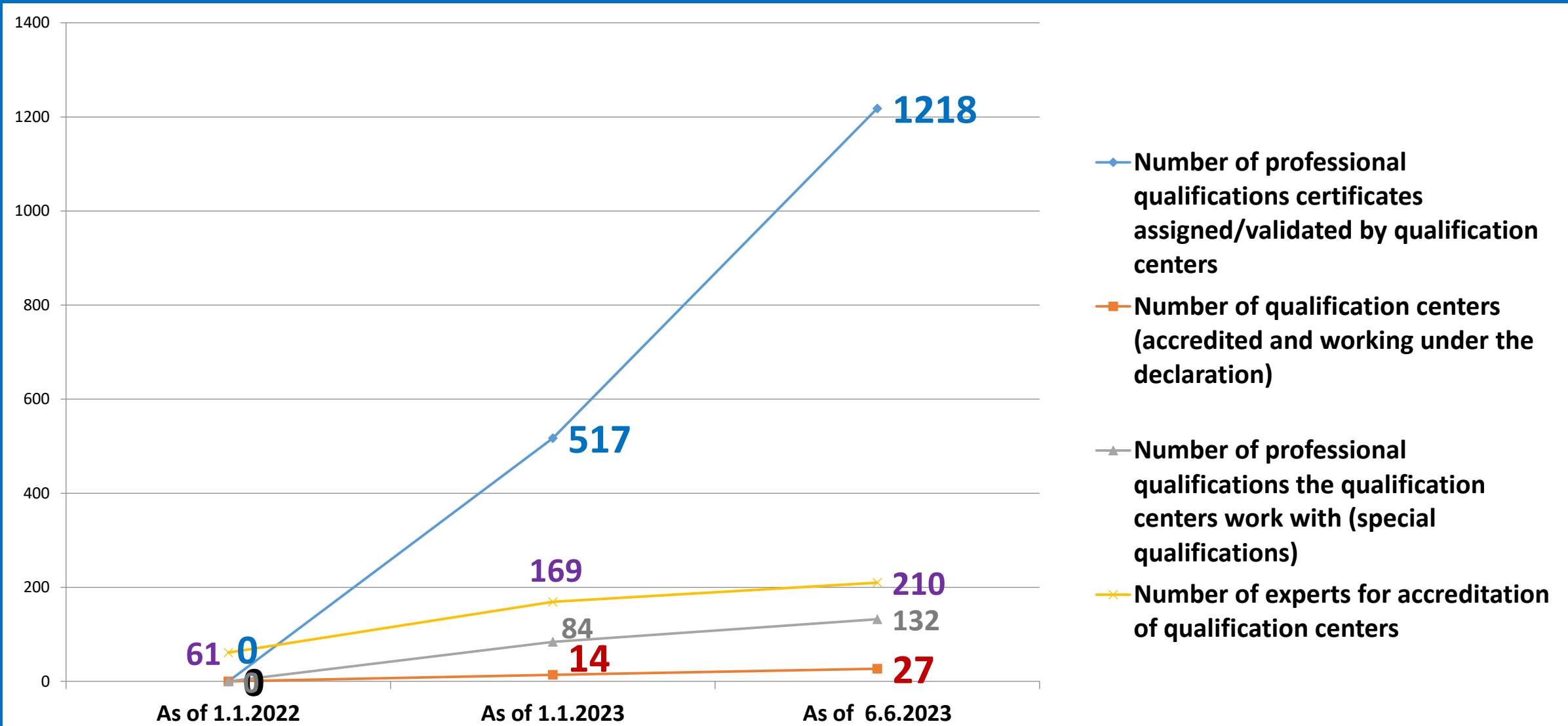
Universities and their role in qualification systems: *(non)rhetorical questions*
