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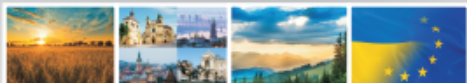

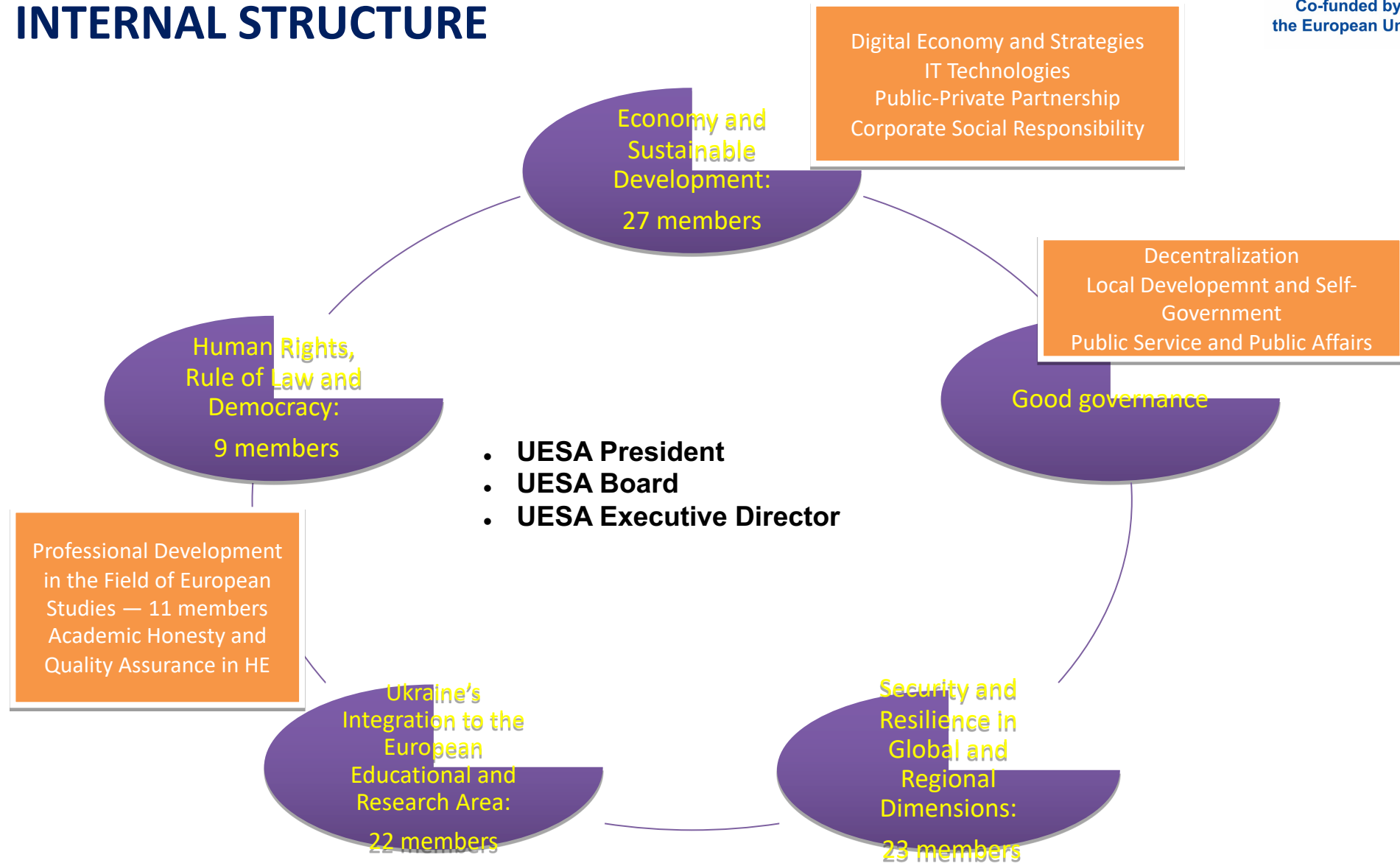
Mission — to give academic and professional support for Ukraine's integration into European and Euroatlantic structures at highest academic quality standards

UESA Member Profile:

- 44,1% holding the candidate degree/PhD degree, 37,3% holding the doctor of sciences degree and habilitation.
- Wast majority of experts coming from economics, but law, political sciences, pedagogy, history are represented as well among members.
- Most members are coming from Dnipro region (22%), city of Kyiv (20%), Lviv region (11%) followed closely by Volyn, Charkiv and Odessa regions.
- Membership is free of charge.

The HORIZON project EMBRACING change (Overcoming Blockages and Advancing Democracy in the European Neighbourhood) aims to respond to the counter-democracy trends after the coloured revolutions and the Arab Spring. It does so through an interdisciplinary, multi-method and cross-regional assessment of both blockages to and drivers of democratisation in 12 case study countries across Eastern Europe, Southern Caucasus, Western Balkans, Northern Africa and the Middle East.
