About UL Think Tank LV PEAK

- University of Latvia think tank LV PEAK (LV PEAK) is a research institute at the Faculty of Business, Management and Economics of the University of Latvia.
- The Productivity Research Institute LV PEAK was established on 25 November 2019. The basis of the LV PEAK is a recommendation issued by the Council of the European Union on 20 September 2016 and the 29 October 2019 decision of the Cabinet of the Ministers of the Republic of Latvia to nominate The University of Latvia think tank LV PEAK as a National Productivity Board of Latvia and thus to delegate it to represent Latvia in the Productivity Network of the EU Member States.
- The origins of the Institute are the Latvian Forum for Productivity, Efficiency, Development, and Competitiveness - Forum LV PEAK, established on May 10, 2018, by the University of Latvia following the initiative of the group of distinguished Latvian researchers.




About UL Think Tank LV PEAK

- The core mission of the LV PEAK is to carry out an independent and scientifically justified analysis of productivity and competitiveness at the national level and to develop policy recommendations for the Latvian government.
- The LV PEAK has a cooperation agreement with the Latvian Academy of Sciences, Latvian Chamber of Commerce and Industry and the Employers' Confederation of Latvia.



About UL Think Tank LV PEAK

- The strategic management of the work of the LV PEAK is ensured by the Productivity Board of Latvia, which consists of 7 highly competent members, including academics and distinguished experts.
- The directions of the scientific activity are determined the Scientific Council of the LV PEAK.







Recommendation by the European Council

- The National Productivity Boards will analyse developments and policies that can affect productivity and competitiveness. They will provide independent analyses and reinforce policy dialogue at the national level.
- This will help reforms aimed at achieving sustainable economic growth and convergence.
- Looking forward, economic growth will depend on increasing productivity. This requires well-balanced policies aimed at supporting innovation, increasing skills, reducing rigidities in labour and product markets and allowing a better allocation of resources.





- National Productivity Boards are independent institutions that help to analyse economic productivity and competitiveness developments and challenges. All euro area countries are invited to have such boards, while other EU countries are encouraged to do so.
- The boards will carry out high quality economic and statistical analysis and make their results available in the public domain. In this way they make a valuable contribution to policy debates in their countries and encourage reforms aimed at achieving sustainable economic growth and convergence. National Productivity Boards may consult relevant stakeholders, though they are required to be objective and neutral.
- The independent expertise of the boards and their annual reports can be used by governments and the European Commission in the context of the annual policy monitoring process, i.e. the European Semester.



The Productivity Board of Latvia

- The Productivity Board of Latvia is an advisory body of the Ministry of Economics, the aim of which is to promote research into the development of economic productivity, to stimulate discussions on the productivity issues in Latvia and the European Union and to promote independent, objective and scientifically sound recommendations to policy makers.
- In accordance with the public interest, the Board submits proposals to the Ministry of Economics on directions of activity in the field of competitiveness and productivity development policy based on co-operation with the Productivity Research Institute of the Faculty of Business, Management and Economics of the University of Latvia "UL Think tank LV PEAK".



The Productivity Board of Latvia

The Board has the following tasks:

- to develop LV PEAK strategic research priorities in the field of national competitiveness and productivity;
- to promote the participation of LV PEAK in the development of Latvian policy planning documents related to the competitiveness and productivity policy issues, and to facilitate their implementation;
- to involve LV PEAK in the assessment of draft legal acts of the Republic of Latvia and the European Union, which relate to competitiveness and productivity policy, and to submit their assessments to the Ministry of Economics;
- to promote cooperation in the field of productivity and competitiveness with the European Commission, the National Productivity Boards of the EU member states, the Ministry of Economics, educational and research institutions, and non-governmental organizations in Latvia and abroad.



Latvia's Productivity Report

- According to the recommendation issued by the European Council, analyses and independent expertise carried out by National Productivity Boards should be publicly available and Boards should publish an annual report.

Latvia's Productivity Report

Latvia's Productivity Report analyses productivity factors and dynamics, presents scenarios for Latvia's economic development over the long term, highlights the main challenges and provides recommendations for policy makers.

In addition, each report includes an in-depth study into a topical area of economics at the time, e.g.: state aid criteria that boost companies' productivity; impact on productivity of remote working; investments and capital return in Latvia). National Productivity Boards also serves as an active agents in domestic discussions on productivity in a form of National Productivity Dialogue, which provides a platform for an exchange of views on productivity-related challenges and possibly appropriate policies in a country to improve mutual understanding of key imperatives for future policies and productivity-enhancing reform.

LV PEAK Productivity Dialogue is an annual event/conference with the goal to discuss national productivity issues, to address the main recent research in the field of productivity and to present Latvia's annual Productivity Report.

LV PEAK Economic Barometer

• PERIODICITY – 2x a year (June, December).

- CONTENT analysis and forecasts of the main indicators of economic development (GDP, labor market, inflation, productivity, labor costs, etc.), recommendations for improving the situation, analysis of leading indicators, review of forecasts of other institutions, youth sentiment survey.
- **THE LV PEAK EXPERT PANEL** the Productivity Board of Latvia, the Productivity Research Institute of the University of Latvia, the Faculty of Business, Management and Economics of the University of Latvia, the Fiscal Discipline Council, the Latvian Academy of Sciences, etc.

- Youth Sentiment Survey conducted by the research center SKDS, surveying Latvian residents aged 16 to 29, the survey will be annual, which will allow the development of the Youth Mood Index

2020/2021 Latvian State Research Project: Towards the Post-pandemic Recovery: Economic, Political and Legal Framework for Preservation of Latvia's Growth Potential and Increasing Competitiveness "reCOVery-LV"

Aim: the reCOVery-LV is an academic multidisciplinary applied study in which comprehensive analysis and policy recommendations were developed on reducing pandemic crisis economic consequences and fostering economic recovery.

Aim: Ministry of Economics in collaboration with LV PEAK will establish and maintain an economic modelling system to determine the economic impact of meeting the identified economic and climate objectives.

>2022 Project Implementation of the measures in the field of investment and productivity

Aim: Within the framework of the project LV PEAK and the Ministry of Economics cooperates to raise public awareness of challenges in the field of productivity and promote activities necessary for the transformation of the economy towards the creation of higher added value, responding to challenges and opportunities in international markets and ensuring an increase in export potential.

Outputs:

>2022/2023 Project Creation of a quantitative assessment model for the evaluation of the impact of European Union funding programmes on the Latvian economy

Aim: LV PEAK is developing a new macroeconomic model system on behalf of the Ministry of Finance in order to evaluate the impact of the European Union's Funds on Latvian economy. With the aim of reflecting the overall impact of EU funding programmes on the country's main macroeconomic indicators.



Government public consultations

- ➤ At the request of the Ministry of Finance (FM letter No. 5.1 of February 8, 2021 25/21/720) the Fiscal Discipline Council in cooperation LV PEAK established an expert panel to evaluate the Recovery and Resilience Mechanism (RMM) plan for Latvia. The purpose of the expert panel was to identify the macroeconomic and fiscal impact of the RMM plan and to assess the compliance of the included reforms and projects with the tasks and priorities defined in the RMM.
- LV PEAK has participated in a meeting on Experimental statistics of productivity indicators. The meeting was organized by the Annual National Accounts Department of the Central Statistical Bureau (CSB) to discuss the possible development of productivity indicators that would be needed by the main users of national accounts data.
