Introduction














In the face of war, social disruption, and demographic change, Ukrainian universities are placing growing emphasis on their third mission – serving society and responding to urgent social needs.



The main attention is paid to the practices of social inclusion, intersectoral cooperation and sustainable development.




Figure 1. Directions for implementing ideas of social inclusion in DUSU



- development of self-advocacy skills in students with special educational needs etc.





















SERVICE LEARNING, COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP:


- student volunteering
